## Dwelling in the Sukkah

Blessed are You, Adonai our God, Sovereign of the universe, who makes us holy with mitzvot and commands us to dwell in the *sukkah*.

On Sukkot we celebrate the harvest that was gathered by farmers in the Land of Israel many centuries ago. Still today, Jews farm the Land of Israel, and the earth returns their love with food for the body.

But our Torah reminds us that it is not good enough to have food for ourselves alone. It is a mitzvah to feed the hungry, and we know that many around us, and in the world, are very poor and hungry. Let part of our Sukkot celebration be to bring a harvest offering of food for those who are in need.
